In 1984, I was elected Alachua County Commissioner. My campaign manager was Joseph Judge. Also in '84, he was elected as President of the Local Branch of NAACP. Joseph urged me to recommend the DEC organize & train its precinct representatives to form an active structure within each precinct. (38) Now, with 63 precincts, and current events as they are, the spirit of Jefferson calls us to build functional civic engagement in the legal geographies of our precincts. Grass roots democracy for all.

In Florida, legal geographies are enabled within the process of "comprehensive plans". Precincts with elected representatives & functional organizations of democracy and transparency could develop and protect their public interests through their own style of "comprehensive planning". Precincts first then must "duly elect" their representatives.
